LAUNCH OF ACE SILICON VALLEY CHAPTER TO STRENGTHEN ENTREPRENUERSHIP EXCHANGES BETWEEN US-BASED SINGAPOREANS AND THE START-UP COMMUNITY IN SINGAPORE

Singapore, 24 September 2016 – The Action Community for Entrepreneurship (ACE), supported by SPRING Singapore, has launched the ACE Silicon Valley Chapter in San Francisco today.

The initiative was launched by Deputy Prime Minister & Coordinating Minister for National Security, Mr Teo Chee Hean, in conjunction with Singapore Day held in the US.

This ACE Silicon Valley Chapter is a partnership between ACE and US-based Singaporean networks such as Bay Area Tech Singaporeans (BATS), a network of Singaporean technology (tech) professionals, entrepreneurs, business owners and venture capitalists residing in the San Francisco Bay Area.

Bridging tech ecosystems and networks

Through the effort, ACE aims to help Singaporean businesses tap on in-market expertise and networks that their counterparts in the US can provide so as to access the US market with greater ease. Additionally, US-based Singaporeans will be given the opportunity to share their knowledge, experience and networks to help other Singaporeans succeed and grow through this initiative.

The ACE Silicon Valley Chapter aims to build greater connectivity between the vibrant tech ecosystems in Singapore and the Silicon Valley by bridging their respective networks.

"When it comes to learning and adjusting to the local system and market, the journey for many companies is going to be a difficult one. It can take a long time, and will be challenging without the support of a local network. ACE is now set up to help Singapore-based tech start-ups connect to overseas Singaporeans in the US through the ACE Silicon Valley Chapter. Leveraging the support and advice from such network and connection, we are hoping to see strong partnerships with the potential to drive real business impact for Singapore tech start-ups venturing into the US market," said Mr James Tan, Deputy Chairman of ACE Ltd.

"We are excited to help connect Bay Area-based Singaporeans working in tech to help and learn from each other, and we hope to extend this connection to Singaporeans back home through the ACE Silicon Valley Chapter," said Mr Ngiam Jiquan, official spokesman of BATS.

"The US, especially the Silicon Valley, is a hot spot for Singapore start-ups and businesses. In recent years, the government has enhanced overseas linkages for start-ups, such as the establishment of Blk 71@SF, to help Singaporean start-ups access the US market. Government agencies have been assisting our start-ups build networks and forge partnerships in the Silicon Valley through various initiatives and market access programmes.

Beyond government-led initiatives, for Singaporean entrepreneurs and start-ups looking to access and scale in the Silicon Valley, personal connections are often the most powerful networks for greatest leverage. The ACE Silicon Valley Chapter provides a strong support structure, knowledge sharing and access to new contacts," said Mr Ted Tan, Deputy Chief Executive, SPRING Singapore.
